Youth and Women Greenovations Project Workshop AfriLabs Annual Gathering Event

Lusaka -Zambia, 27 October 2022

Objective: To improve knowledge and common understanding on youth and women innovation and entrepreneurship opportunities and needs in the green sectors on the African continent. It further aims to capture ecosystem insights on various aspects related to the promotion of green innovation and entrepreneurship on the continent.

Intended outcomes:

- Improved understanding of the green innovation and entrepreneurship ecosystem landscape and market for African youth and women
- The development of suitable and appropriates measures and actions fostering the promotion of youth and women entrepreneurship on the continent.

Background:

Africa is recording some of the fastest growing economies with a tremendous youth dividend potential. It is forecasted that more than half of the continent population will be under the age of 25 by 2050, and that there is a tremendous economic potential for the continent if subsequent investments are made on human capital. In addition, it has been identified that a gender gap exists in entrepreneurship ventures on the continent which should be addressed to unlock women entrepreneurship potential and make a huge contribution to the continent's growth and prosperity. Youth and women private sector development can therefore be enhanced by expanding the portfolio of bankable, concept-proofed green business models that are investor ready.

About the YW-GE project:

The Empowering African Youth and Women Green Entrepreneurs (Youth & Women Greenovations) project seeks to contribute to the green economic transformation of the African continent building on its youth dividend, and the tremendous youth entrepreneurship potential for wealth and job opportunities creation. The project focus on green sectors which are sectors associated to the green economy striving to the establishment of a more inclusive economy addressing human wellbeing and social justice in harmony with the ecological environment.
